As the victim was getting out of the car, one suspect pointed a gun to his head and fired a round. The second suspect reached into the victims pocket and took his wallet and then hit him on the head. The officers recovered one shell casing and submitted it for entry into NIBIN. A day later, Dallas Police officers responded to a homicide. Officers found that while the victim and his wife were sitting in a parking lot, they were approached by a male who demanded money. The victim drove off, at which time the suspect fired a round and fatally killed the victim. Later that same day, officers obtained a series of search warrants which led to a recovered a gun.
